From the vicar... In May we welcomed Archbishop Justin to Coventry Diocese in this our centenary year. The visit coincided with and culminated in a centenary festival at the cathedral – a wonderful day of celebration. Also on the Archbishop's itinerary were visits to churches, schools, colleges, hospitals, businesses and community groups across the diocese. I made it along to some of the gatherings and heard the Archbishop speak several times; each time what he said was engaging and inspiring. However the thing that stayed with me most was something he said in the ruins of the old cathedral. In a brief interview with Bishop Christopher, Archbishop Justin said that when he took on the role of Archbishop he challenged himself to never give an interview or talk without mentioning Jesus. He confessed that he may have failed a few times but generally he has been true to his word. Whilst mentioning Jesus might be the expectation we have of an archbishop or any member of the clergy perhaps the essence of the Archbishop's challenge to himself was to remember the purpose and person behind his calling. Bringing the name of Jesus into each interview and talk is a decision to make your life and your work about Jesus and not allow any status, fame or achievements to over-shadow who you are called to be. We certainly see in Archbishop Justin, someone whose life is centred around Christ. But perhaps that challenge is not just for senior clergy or for clergy at all. Maybe it is just the call of every Christian—to have Jesus in our hearts and in our lives and His name on our lips so that people can see in us and hear from us the good news that is on offer. KB
